
Let's prevent accidents together


DO NOT START WORK WITHOUT THE CORRECT TRAINING.

NEVER ENTER AN EXCAVATION SITE BEFORE MAKING SURE OF ITS SAFETY.




SAFETY HARNESSES SAVE LIVES EVERY YEAR.

DUST EXTRACTION ON WORKSITES CAN BE MANAGED EFFICIENTLY.




FALLING EVEN FROM A LOW HEIGHT CAN CAUSE SERIOUS INJURIES.

REMEMBER THAT THE PURPOSE OF THE INSTRUCTIONS IS TO ENSURE YOU ARE SAFE.




USE A DEDICATED RADIO CHANNEL TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE CRANE OPERATOR.

MAKE SURE EVERYONE GETS THEIR MESSAGE UNDERSTOOD.




DISTRIBUTION BOARDS AND CABLES SHOULD BE LOCATED OFF THE GROUND AND AWAY FROM VEHICLE ROUTES.

MAKE SURE ALL YOUR EXTENSION CABLES AND POWER TOOLS ARE IN A GOOD CONDITION.







MODERN PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT IS GOOD-LOOKING AND COMFORTABLE TO WEAR.

USING PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT SHOWS EVERYONE THAT YOU ARE A PROFESSIONAL.



A PROPERLY MADE PLAN FOR FALL PROTECTION IS THE FOUNDATION OF SAFETY AT WORK.

MAKE SURE THAT THE PROTECTION ALSO REMAINS IN GOOD WORKING ORDER.




SERIOUS ACCIDENTS AND EVEN DEATHS STILL HAPPEN ON CONSTRUCTION SITES.
